Description

The Space Podium was conceptualised as an innovative educational initiative aimed at empowering school students to explore and articulate ideas related to space, science, and innovation through the powerful platforms of debate and public speaking. Recognising the growing interest in space sciences and the importance of communication skills in youth development, the Rotaract Club of Colombo Fort joined hands with SEDS Sri Lanka and SEDS Juniors to organise a first-of-its-kind trilingual debate and speech competition.

The name "*The Space Podium*" was chosen to represent a platform for young voices to speak on universal issues, particularly those relating to outer space, innovation, and sustainability, in **Sinhala, Tamil, and English** – breaking language barriers and promoting inclusivity.

What started as a small brainstorming session between RACCF and SEDS turned into a massive, island-wide event that brought together **over 300 students from more than 50 schools**, making it one of the largest youth-led space awareness campaigns in Sri Lanka's educational sphere.

Objectives

- **Promote STEM Awareness:** To educate and engage students with space science, astronomy, and related global challenges.
- **Develop Communication Skills:** To empower students in articulating complex ideas through structured debate and persuasive speech.
- **Celebrate Linguistic Diversity:** To offer equal opportunity to students of all backgrounds by facilitating the competition in Sinhala, Tamil, and English.
- **Foster Critical Thinking:** To encourage informed discussion and research-driven arguments on futuristic themes.
- **Build National Networks:** To connect schools, students, and educators around a common educational cause.

Project Planning

Planning Timeline:

- Mid December: Project ideation and collaboration initiation with SEDS Sri Lanka
- Late December: Partner confirmations, school outreach, and launch of participant registration
- January February: Preliminary rounds, mentorship programs, and speech/debate coaching
- Final Week (February or March): Grand finale conducted with live judging panels

Team Division:

- RACCF: Oversaw overall project management, hosting, coordination with judges, and speech training
- SEDS Juniors: Handled school outreach, speaker mentorship, and scientific content verification
- CIDS: Coordinated logistics, digital promotion, and language translation/interpretation support
- **Media and PR Team:** Managed visuals, livestreaming (if online), digital promotions, and post-event publishing
- **Judging Panel Coordination:** Experts from academia, astronomy clubs, and speech coaches formed the adjudicator body

Public Relations Plan

Pre-Event:

- Inspired continued engagement in STEM subjects and public discourse

- Boosted institutional credibility for all organising bodies among schools and youth stakeholders

Areas of Improvements

- Future editions could offer personalised feedback to participants post-performance
- Improve logistical tracking of participant data for more targeted follow-ups
- Expand to include workshop components or regional preliminary rounds
- Develop an alumni network of Space Podium participants for continuous engagement
